

# SENATE RESOLUTION 2223 – 067 RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE SGA GENERAL BYLAWS CONCERNING THE INVESTIGATIVE POWERS OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 2023

Whereas the Student Government Association governing documents demonstrate the importance of adequate oversight as well as the principles of checks and balances, and Whereas the main oversight authority of the Judicial Branch, with special consideration to the impeachment process, is the Executive Branch, and Whereas unlike the Supreme Court and Student Senate, the Executive Branch does not have explicit investigative powers listed in any governing documents, and Whereas it is essential that these powers be on par with the investigative powers of the Supreme Court and be narrow in scope to serve the specific purpose of reasonable oversight, let it be Resolved that the Student Senate approves the attached amendment to the Student Government

#### Section 4. Judicial Impeachment Process

All members of the Judicial Branch are subject to impeachment and removal from office. All complaints should be made via the specified Executive Branch complaint form. The impeachment process must follow Article VI Section 4 of the Student Government Association Constitution. At no point during a judicial impeachment proceeding shall the President remove a voting member of the Executive Branch from office. A vote of impeachment in the Senate must be done by a roll-call vote.

### **Proposed Text:**

#### Section 4. Judicial Impeachment Process

All members of the Judicial Branch are subject to impeachment and removal from office. All complaints should be made via the specified Executive Branch complaint form. The impeachment process must follow Article VI Section 4 of the Student Government Association Constitution. At no point during a judicial impeachment proceeding shall the President remove a voting member of the Executive Branch from office. During the course of disciplinary action or investigation of the Judiciary or a member thereof, the Executive Branch shall have powers on par with those held by the Supreme Court for such proceedings, which include, but are not limited to, the subpoena of information and calling of hearings. A vote of impeachment in the Senate must be done by a roll-call vote.
